If the student or parent needs to contact me directly it is highly recommended that they use the email provided at the beginning of this syllabus. **I will not text you directly to your phone without being in a group text with the parent. This rule is per our accreditation.**

Technology in the Classroom

Due to the use of Google Classroom, it will become necessary for students to utilize a laptop or tablet computer in class. Students are expected to conduct themselves online the same way they would in a classroom. Students may use their cellphones if they are not able to bring a computer. Students will be expected to stay focused, and on task for any assignment that they are given. Collaboration is an important part of learning and I will be utilizing projects with collaboration components. Any student who is found to be using technology in the classroom in a way that is not conducive to learning or that breaks any of the CVA rules will lose their privilege to work on a computer in class and will have to complete assignments on paper while on campus. Students will still be expected to complete and upload all assignments to Google Classroom, on time, as assigned. While I encourage you to download the Google Classroom app on your cell phones in order to keep track of your assignments.

- ✎ Students will turn in all writing assignments on Google Classroom via Google Docs.
